Pastor's Page

Dear Friends,

On Sunday, I will be preaching about the juxtaposition between faith and action in the story of Mary and Martha found in Luke 10, which follows last week's sermon on the Good Samaritan. Mary found her faith at the foot of Jesus, as much as the Good Samaritan found his faith in kindly service, just in a different way. For the maturing Christian, what we do and how we devote ourselves to God are both equally important. For Christians, our service toward others is a demonstration of why we believe what we believe.

Kindly service as an expression of our devotion of faith is demonstrated following the catastrophic July 4 floods along the Guadalupe River, which tragically claimed over 134 lives, with over 100 lives left missing, churches throughout Kerr County mobilized in defense of their community. For example, the First Presbyterian Church in Kerrville was swiftly transformed into a reunification center and shelter for those displaced. On Sunday, Pastor Jasiel Hernandez Garcia shifted the planned Independence Day sermon to one of healing and hope. He spoke about choosing action over despair and turning grief into service.

The First Baptist Church of Marble Falls organized "mud-out" teams across Kerr,

Burnet, and Llano counties.
Volunteers were also trained to provide spiritual and emotional comfort to residents. Marble Falls Family Discipleship Pastor Tucker Edwards hosted a prayer and worship night attended by over 300 volunteers. A dedicated spiritual counseling team supported those emotionally



shattered by disaster. Citywest Church became a logistics hub, supporting Mercy Chefs and Salvation Army teams that distributed 4,000 meals daily to first responders and flood survivors. And finally, Pastor Joey Tombrella of First Baptist Kerrville posted

a heartfelt video, calling congregants to gather and pray: "Jesus is our hope," he said, stressing endurance and community in a long recovery ahead.

These responses exemplify core Christian teachings—loving neighbors, comforting the afflicted, and leading with faith, not politics. These churches lived out Matthew 25:35–36, binding spiritual care with practical action:

"For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat... I was a stranger and you invited me in..."

In the devastation's wake, faith became tangible: Buildings weren't simply used—they became beacons of help. Prayer wasn't passive—it was central. Community wasn't just served—it was held. In Kerr County's darkest hours, these Christian congregations didn't just preach—they acted on their convictions. They demonstrated what the Good Samaritan did—not just for those they knew but anyone in trouble.

At Pioneer, we are called to live out our faith in similar ways. I am so proud of what we are doing to help the less fortunate and care for those who have so little. We are living out our faith by being good Samaritans. We also devote ourselves to Jesus' teachings. We have a vital and active prayer ministry that helps others in their struggles. In each way, we live what we say we believe. I am so proud of our Pioneers. If you can think of another way we can help others, please let me or Katrina Copple know. Together, we can help make lives better.

Please remember to keep the workers in Texas, those who have died, and the families who have lost so much, in your prayers and devotions. What a devastating loss this was.

I've written before about the BWV numbers that serve as a catalogue of Bach's works by genre. BWV numbers 525-721 are works for organ. They do not work well if played on the piano. But BWV 722-994 are for harpsichord, and these do transfer very well to the piano. Now that our wonderful Baldwin piano, manufactured in 1930, has been refurbished, I really enjoy playing works like Bach's *French Suite in G-major*, BWV 816. Each movement of these suites is based on a Baroque dance. This Sunday I'll play the *Allemande*, *Sarabande*, and *Gavotte*.


Remembering Your Pledges

Clothing Donations



Music Review at First United Methodist Church



CONTINUING ANNOUNCEMENTS OF THE CHURCH

+ Where to Park. There is no free metered parking outside the church. However, there is free parking underground next door/behind the church in the underground car park at the Teichert/Sutter underground parking garage. Enter Capitol Street between the garage and the hospital. The parking gate is open 9:00 AM – 12:30 PM on Sundays. You may park in any space, even if it is marked as reserved.



During the weekdays, we have the entire basement level (B2) available for parking, but you will need to obtain a parking card to access the closed gate, unless we have prearranged an event for the gates to be open. On-street parking is available where meters are present. If you are willing to walk a couple of blocks, on-street parking with no meters allows for 2 hours of free parking.
